COVID-19 Stakeholder Update / 04.05.20

- We have robust and flexible plans to ensure we can continue to deliver key services across the justice system.
- A network of priority courts will remain open during the coronavirus pandemic to make sure the justice system continues to operate effectively.
- Selected lower-risk offenders, within weeks of their release dates, and pregnant women in custody who do not pose a high risk of harm to the public will be temporarily released from prison. Additionally, works have begun to deliver 500 temporary, single occupancy units at seven jails. This will increase space in prisons and limit the spread of Coronavirus helping protect staff, prisoners and the NHS.

NEW: The MoJ has announced £5.4m funding to support the legal advice sector during the COVID-19 pandemic. The funding will help organisations continue to provide vital legal advice, increase capacity, and deliver services remotely. The Access to Justice Foundation and the Law Centres Network will administer the funding and be overseen by the Community Justice Fund. Emergency funding to support the most vulnerable in society during the COVID-19 pandemic. An unprecedented £76.4 million package of support to ensure the most vulnerable in society get the support they need during the pandemic has been announced. This includes £28m for the Ministry of Justice. This funding will support survivors of domestic abuse, sexual violence and modern slavery as well as ensuring vulnerable children and young people continue to get the help they need. Prisons and probation services have implemented significant changes to comply with the Government's social distancing rules and to protect staff and service users. The service has been working closely with public health experts, as well as criminal justice partners, to ensure that robust contingency plans are in place and immediate action can be taken wherever cases are identified. As of 17:00 on SUNDAY 3 MAY:

- 357 prisoners have tested positive for COVID-19 across 73 prisons;
- 395 prison staff have tested positive for COVID-19 across 67 prisons;
- 13 Prisoner Escort and Custody Services (PECS) staff have tested positive for COVID-19.

Further updates with the latest figures may be released later this evening to the media and will be included here the following day for information, so please do bear with us if they are superseded during the day.
